VENUE

Lake Banook is rich in canoe history. It is a natural freshwater lake, and part of a system of lakes and canals that connect the Halifax Harbour to the Bay of Fundy—a distance spanning over 114km. Here you'll find three separate canoe clubs: MMAAC, Senobe, and Banook. Each has its own story, history and past champions, dating back to the creation of the Banook Canoe Club in 1904. The Lake frequently hosts provincial, national, and international competitions for various age groups and abilities, most notably the World Junior Canoe Sprint Championships in 1989, the World Marathon Canoe Championships in 2001, and the Senior World Canoe Sprint Championships in 1997 and 2009.

THE FIRST RESIDENTS

The Mi'kmaq and their ancestors have lived in Nova Scotia and the other Maritime Provinces for over 10,000 years. Throughout their habitation of the province, they have used lakes and rivers left behind by the Ice Age as highways through the wilderness.

The rivers and lakes were major transport routes for the Mi'kmaq, serving as water highways from their winter camps in Shubenacadie to their summer camps on the shores of K'jipuktuk (Halifax) and Punamu'kwati'jk (Dartmouth).

In the Mi'kmaq dialect, Banook means "First Lake," and the Mi'kmaq were the first to navigate the waters of Panuk (Lake Banook).

THE BOAT THAT CONNECTED THE PROVINCE

The vehicle of choice for the Mi'kmaq was the birchbark canoe. It had rounded edges with a wide-bottomed interior and could be used in both fresh and saltwater.

The Algonquian peoples across North America have similar canoes to that of the Milkman, a design that was admired by many European settlers.





EVENT FESTIVAL

From August 3-7 we will be hosting a Festival along Prince Albert Road featuring a local artisan marketplace, food truck vendors, family-friendly activities, a licensed lakeside patio, and evening performances from Canadian artists on the main stage. The Festival will showcase the rich culture of our local and regional communities. Stay tuned for the full schedule of events and performer announcements.

ABOUT DARTMOUTH

Affectionately nicknamed the "City of Lakes", Dartmouth, Nova Scotia contains 23 distinctive lakes, each with their own unique natural features and surroundings. Dartmouth is home to four of Nova Scotia's eight sprint canoe clubs, and serves as a training hub for national team athletes. Located just across the harbour from Halifax's bustling core, Dartmouth offers a different experience entirely—combining modern shops, eateries, cafes, forests, trails and waterways. Within minutes, visitors can trade in the small but mighty downtown area for the quiet and calm of Dartmouth's parks and beaches.

CANOE '22 FACTS

- The 2022 ICF Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe World Championships program includes women's and men's categories. Races will be held in both canoe and kayak with single, double, and quad boat disciplines.
- Thirty-two different preliminaries and finals will be raced in 200, 500, 1000, and 5000-metre distances.
 Over 600 volunteers and more than 80,000 volunteer hours will support the delivery of the event. For details and contact information, visit <u>canoe22.com</u>.
- Based on the 2009 event, over 40,000 on-site spectators are expected to view the competition over five days of racing.
- Several streets in Dartmouth will have restricted access or be closed leading up to and during the event.
 Residents who may be affected by this should verify the RoadWorks Map through HRM or call 511.
- The main spector seating area will be on Silvers
 Hill. Two additional bleachers will be available along

 Prince Albert Rd and in the festival's beer garden for
 those 19+. Spectators are welcome to bring blankets
 and chairs. The existing seating can accommodate

 4,000+ spectators.
- Atlantic Division of CanoeKayak Canada offers an <u>Indigenous program</u> for Indigenous youth to try paddling.
- Canoe '22 is expected to generate over \$20 million in economic activity.
