

CORRIDOR COMMUNITY OPTIONS FOR ADULTS

HOUSE RULES FOR THE CCOA 50/50 DRAW

1. Purchasers of tickets must be at least 19 years of age to play.
2. The prize is 50% of the gross amount raised.
3. Corridor Community Options For Adults will retain the other 50% and is responsible for paying all fees and expenses related to conducting the lottery.
4. The Lottery will begin on November 12, 2020. Ticket sales end on December 15, 2020 at midnight. The tickets will be printed and placed in a sealed container. The winning ticket will be drawn and announced live on Facebook at or near 12:00 pm on December 18th, 2020.
5. The draw will take place at 21 Convent Road, Enfield, NS, B2T 1C9 and witnessed by one (1) Board Member and two (2) management staff of CCOA. The prize money will be mailed in the form of a cheque to the winner. The name on the cheque will be the same as the name on the winning ticket.
6. The holder of the winning ticket will have 90 days to claim their prize. If the prize is not claimed within 90 days, the winner forfeits their claim and a second draw will take place.
7. The draw will be recorded through video on Facebook and supervised by the Licensee. The draw will be executed by removing a printed ticket from a sealed container that contains all the sold tickets in the 50/50 draw.
8. The Winner agrees to grant to Corridor Community Options For Adults the right to publish, through all types of media broadcasting, including the internet, for the purposes of promoting the win, their full name, hometown and photograph without any claim for broadcasting, printing or other rights. The Winner shall not be compensated for such participation. The Winner agree to have no claim against Corridor Community Options For Adults for invasion of privacy or any other ground(s) by reason of the publication or broadcasting of their name, hometown or photograph or information voluntarily provided.
9. Sponsors, donors, volunteers, employees and members of the Board of Directors will all be permitted to purchase tickets.

10. The two managers of Corridor Community Options For Adults, named as the licensees of the Lottery are not permitted to purchase tickets.
11. The Proceeds of the Lottery shall accrue to Corridor Community Options For Adults, a registered Canadian Charity. Corridor Community Options For Adults will accrue the funds towards their building renewal project.
12. The Geographic location of the Lottery is the Province of Nova Scotia and no tickets will be offered for sale to residents outside of Nova Scotia.
13. Tickets will be sold on-line through Experience Funding.
